

Sundays

10:00 AM Worship in the Sanctuary, livestreamed on Facebook and YouTube

Worship at Wake Forest Presbyterian Church "joyfully ascribes all praise and honor, glory and power to the Lord... Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In worship, the people of God acknowledge God as present in the world and in our lives. As we respond to God's claim and redemptive action in Jesus Christ, believers are transformed and renewed. We offer ourselves to God and are better equipped for God's service in the world." [Book of Order, W-1.1001]

Our service features a blend of contemporary and traditional music, which elicits a high level of engagement from the congregation. The service in our sanctuary includes traditional hymns and anthems, as well as sacred pieces by current arrangers and composers, led by the Chancel Choir and our Praise Team.

Communion

First Sunday of each month

On the first Sunday of each month, we celebrate communion together. From the PC(USA): "The Lord's Supper enacts and seals what the Word proclaims: God's sustaining grace offered to all people. The Lord's Supper is at once God's gift of grace, God's means of grace, and God's call to respond to that grace..." All who accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior are invited to the Communion Table at Wake Forest Presbyterian Church. The grace of God is available wherever we are, and that is something to celebrate! If you are worshipping online, we ask you to have your own elements ready — though we use bread and grape juice at church, anything will work.

SPECIAL WORSHIP SERVICES

All Saints Healing and Wholeness Service

Tuesday, November 1 at 1 PM and 7 PM in the Sanctuary

This special worship service is traditionally held near November 1 (All Saints' Day). It is a reminder that we are part of the continuing communion of saints...a time to claim our kinship with those who have gone before us...and a time for the church to be faithful in life and service for all who have been witnesses to God's love in this world. Those who have lost a loved one in the past year may find comfort in this service. Childcare will be provided for the evening service.

Blue Christmas Service

Tuesday, December 20 7 PM in the Sanctuary

Christmas can be a time of great joy, but for many it can also be a time of sadness, grief, and loneliness. If you share those feelings, we invite you to come and sit with one another in a liturgy that speaks of the love of God for the grieving.

Christmas Eve Services

Saturday, December 24 4 PM and 7 PM in the Sanctuary

We invite you to join us in celebrating the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ, on Christmas Eve. Each service will include candlelight, music and scripture. Our 4:00 service is specifically designed for families with young children.

Music Ministry

WFPC's Music Ministry is an open, welcoming, diverse group of loving, dedicated and talented servants whose mission is to share the gospel of Jesus Christ through song; lead and encourage the congregation in both traditional and contemporary worship; and provide an avenue through which individuals may share their gifts and be an integral part of the worship. The music ministry is comprised of the Praise Team, Chancel Choir, Grace Notes Hand Bell Choir, and the Children's Alleluia Choir. There are also opportunities for individuals and groups to share their musical gifts in worship by providing our offertory music. If you have a heart for worship and music, our music ministry is a safe place for you to bring your heart and your gifts to God, to tune in, and to deepen the worship of your heart in a community of believers. The goal for this elective series is to equip our learners so they can articulate both sides of the modern Christian spectrum to better define who we are as a denomination, who we are as WFPC, and where the learner lands on the spectrum. At July's 225th General Assembly, votes were taken on several of these issues that show the range of theological diversity within the PCUSA denomination as well as Christendom as a whole. Mission

Our Mission is to provide a loving Christian program that will minister to children, their parents, and the staff that cares for them.

We encourage many areas of a child's development — spiritual, cognitive, social, physical, and emotional — by providing a safe, nurturing environment and developmentally appropriate activities. We will seek to awaken each child's love of learning and sense of wonder. Our Christian atmosphere will help children realize their value and responsibilities as children of God.

We recognize the important role of parents as partners in their children's education and strongly encourage active participation. We want to foster an atmosphere of support and fellowship for these parents. We will maintain strong communications to keep parents abreast of the school's activities and their children's progress. We realize you are your child's most important advocate.

We value our teachers and staff and want to provide them with a pleasant and meaningful working environment that allows them to grow personally, spiritually, and professionally. We are dedicated to giving them the support they need to help their students achieve the objectives set out for them and to maintain a safe and happy classroom.

Developmentally Appropriate Learning

We develop our curriculum to meet your child's specific developmental needs, using a variety of experiences to ensure a great educational foundation and kindergarten readiness. Literary Activities develop reading readiness, encourage curiosity, enhance listening skills, and let us explore the world around us. Sensory Experiences teach about nature, science, physics, math, categorization and patterns, while encouraging eye -hand coordination and fine-tuning different senses. Structure in our preschool day teaches successful strategies for classroom behavior, builds awareness of time concepts and sequence, and bolsters self-discipline and independence. Art Activities develop fine motor skills, familiarize us with colors and shapes, master pre-writing skills, help us to use scissors, and encourage creativity and imagination. Dramatic and Outdoor Play enhance social skills, teach problem solving, encourage imagination, and build gross motor skills.

Adult Mission Trip September 11-16

In 2005, after the devastation of Hurricane Katrina on the Gulf Coast of the U.S., a group was formed to respond to this natural disaster and a ministry was formed. Groups of adults have traveled and assisted in other areas of the country with disaster recovery, mostly through the PC(USA) division of Presbyterian Disaster Relief in the years since that first trip. In recent years, the trips have been to communities in Eastern NC still impacted by the storms that come year after year. Backpack Buddies

This ongoing ministry helps to feed children in our community. We partner with three local elementary and middle schools to supply food-insecure children meals they can take home over the weekend when they don't have regular access to school meals. If you'd like to help, we are packing weekly meals of canned food items and delivering them for distribution to the schools. If you'd like to donate food we routinely use canned soups, ramen noodles, canned chicken and tuna, canned pasta, mac n cheese, canned vegetables, canned fruit, canned chili, Pop-Tarts, oatmeal and juice boxes. (No glass please, and easy open

tab tops are always preferred.) Food donations may be dropped off in the collection bins located in the Narthex Donation closet or at the collection table near the CLC entrance near the parking lot. Blood Drive October 2 at WFPC

WFPC partners with The Blood Connection (TBC) to host three blood drives a year. TBC is a community blood supplier primarily serving NC, SC and GA. Donors provide lifesaving blood to neighbors and friends in our region. There are opportunities to not only donate blood but to volunteer time to facilitate each drive's success. During the pandemic, the need for blood is especially great, and TBC has developed safety protocols to ensure the safety of its donors and volunteers. Community Garden

WFPC's Giving Garden provides seasonal fruits and vegetables to over 100 households with food insecurity per week, year-round. There is always a variety of work to be done in the garden, suitable to different ages and ability levels. With our commitment to making our garden user friendly, we have installed table planters for adults and children, including wheelchair accessible planters. Family Promise

Family Promise, formerly Wake Interfaith Hospitality Network (WIHN), along with area churches, provides professional case management as well as food, shelter and transportation for families experiencing homelessness as they work to restore their independence. Churches provide food and fellowship to families during a one-week stay at the church facilities. Families stay overnight in the church and in the mornings are transported to the Family Promise center in Raleigh for the day where they are provided with day care for their children, transportation, transitional housing assistance, job placement assistance, financial counseling, family crisis counseling and much more. Families return to the church later in the day where they are hosted with dinner and fellowship. COVID has put this mission into a state of flux, and we are awaiting word from Family Promise to let us know when they've resumed asking churches to host on-site. Journey Ministry Food Pantry

The Journey Ministry Pantry (thejourneyministrypantry.com) is a faith-based nonprofit organization in Youngsville providing food to needy families in Franklin and surrounding counties. It currently serves about 30 families, and is expected to double in the coming months. Volunteers collect donated food from local grocery stores, supplemented with private donations and donations from local churches, including WFPC. The WFPC community garden has been providing fresh vegetables to the Pantry for the past few years. Journey welcomes volunteers to pick up food at local grocery stores, pack the boxes we hand out, and assist with food distribution on Tuesday afternoons. Quarterly, on Saturday mornings (next dates are September 3 and December 3), the Food Bank provides a truckload of food for the pantry to hand out to families in need. 
SCOUTING AT WFPC


